LUCE SCHOLARS PROGRAM

DESCRIPTION: The Luce Scholars Program provides stipends, language training, and individualized professional placements in Asia for 15 to 18 young Americans each year. The University of Virginia may nominate several students or graduates to be considered for the program. The UVa deadline is October 2, 2009 (noon).

Nominees should have a record of high achievement, outstanding leadership ability, and a clearly defined career interest with evidence of potential for professional accomplishment. Those who already have significant experience in Asia or Asian studies are not eligible for the Luce Scholars Program.
