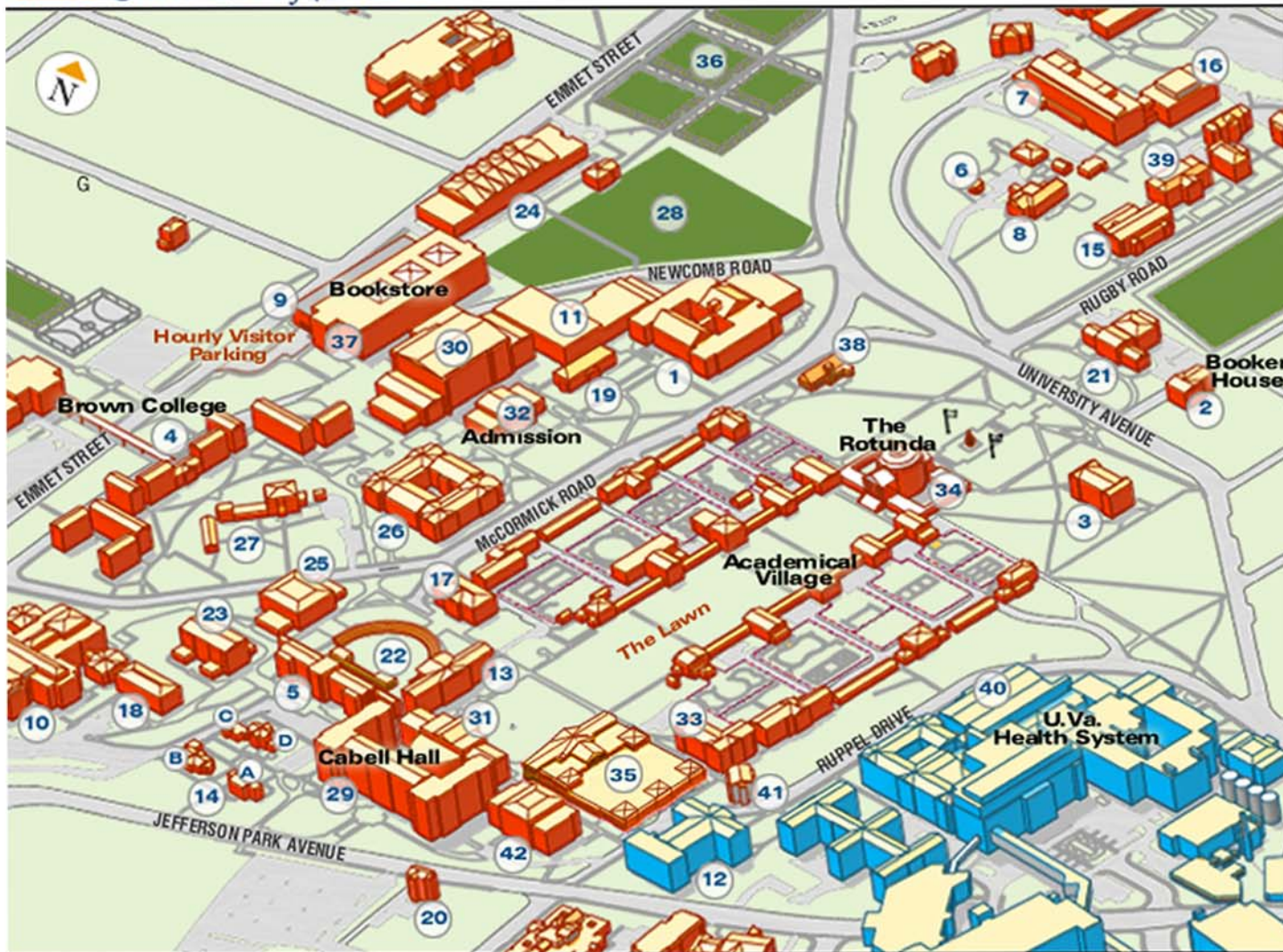

New Parking Information - Change of Parking Location!

Due to many events happening at U. Va. on October 30, all Open House attendees must park in the Hourly Parking Garage beneath the Newcomb Hall Bookstore at 400 Emmet Street South. Above is a map of Grounds showing the location of the Hourly Parking Garage (#9) and Campbell Hall (#7). Please note that attendees will be expected to pay for parking.

From the Hourly Parking Garage, you can walk through Grounds up to McCormick Road. Take a left on McCormick Road and then a right onto University Avenue. You will see the Rotunda (#34) on your right. Before you reach the Rotunda, turn left onto Rugby Road to reach the School of Architecture, which is located behind the U. Va. Art Museum (#39). When you reach the U. Va. Art Museum, walk up the museum steps as if you were going to enter the building. Rather than entering the museum, walk around the right of building and follow the path. You will see an entrance to Campbell Hall directly in front of you, which will take you to the second floor and the Open House check-in location.
