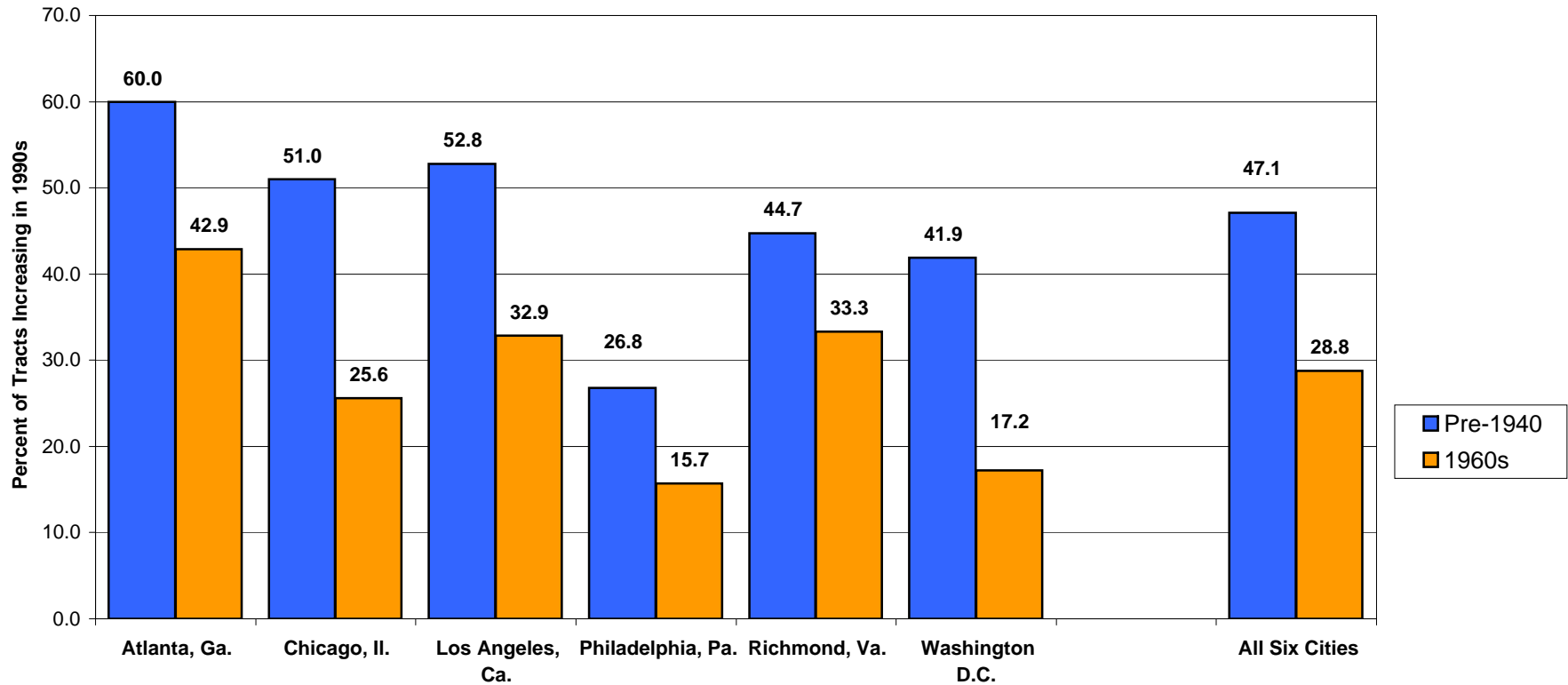


### Comparing Increase in Relative Average Family Income in the 1990s For "Older" and "1960s" Central City Neighborhoods



*A Census Tract's Average Family Income Relative to its Metropolitan Average Family Income is reported here as having "Increased" if it grew by at least 2.5%. A Census Tract is considered "older" if it had 1.5 times or more the metropolitan proportion of housing built Pre-1940. Similarly, a Census Tract is considered to be 1960s if it had 1.5 times or more the metropolitan proportion of housing built during the decade of the 1960s.*
